Part One will include an introduction to the CAH CoP Manual, a review of recent memos issued by CMS and regulatory updates, safe injections, advanced directives, emergency services, drugs and equipment, and observation.

Part Two will include a discussion of those portions of the manual covering pharmacy, dietary and nutrition services, physical environment, emergency department, and patient care policies.

Part Three will include a discussion of those portions of the manual covering infection control, safe medication, patient services, outpatient services, labs, nursing, and discharge planning.

#### Part 4: March 31, 9:00 – 11:00 a.m.

Part Four will include a discussion of those portions of the manual covering radiology, contracts, emergency services, rehab, visitation, medical records, surgery, anesthesia, organ and tissue procurement, and special requirements for CAH providers of long-term care services (swing beds).
