Aims

CHI Health Immanuel will not have any CAUTIs on the acute medical units for FY23

Plan

- Infection Preventionist emails a foley list with a chart review regarding if catheter care was done the prior day to the team members
- Leaders (Director, Manager or Charge RN) will audit foleys daily and provide coaching in the moment and enter the audit into an electronic tool
- Observational Audit includes:
 - Catheter cares BID/PRN, Stat lock in place, No dependent loops in the tubing, Drainage bag below bladder and off the floor, Seal intact/closed system, Need for catheter still appropriate today, Bag labeled with date of insertion
- Director/Managers will "reply all" to the daily email with the foley indication, based on list of approved indications per policy for that day
- Re-education (staff monthly meetings/weekly emails)
 - CAUTI prevention
 - Urine culture checklist (Code P process)
 - Foley alternatives
 - Bladder retention protocol
 - Nurse driven foley removal protocol
- Provider education and coaching in the moment

Measure

- CAUTI infection rate and number of CAUTIS
- Monitor catheter days (device utilization days"
- Monitor electronic tool for daily auditing
