Course Curriculum

This webinar will focus on the legal and risk management challenges that healthcare providers face while caring for patients in the high-risk environment of the Emergency Department (ED).

This session will instruct participants on how to comply with selected Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) hospital Conditions of Participation (CoPs) and Joint Commission standards often found to be problematic for Emergency Department staff. Examples of these challenges include how the visitation law affects the ED and the CMS anesthesia standards on the use of deep sedation or moderate sedation in the Emergency Department; CMS hospital requirements regarding the use of standing orders in the ED; as well as the issue of alarm fatigue and its impact

in the ED including the Joint Commission National Patient Safety Goals and sentinel event alert.

The Joint Commission's standard on patient centered communication will be discussed including the interpreter, low health literacy, and collecting race and ethnicity data in the ED.

Common medication errors that occur in the ED will be reviewed as well as how to avoid the errors initially. CMS made changes to medication management and opioid use, and this is currently an area where hospitals are still struggling to meet compliance.

Finally, the importance of discharge instructions will be covered as they are important to prevent unnecessary readmissions or returns to the ED.

- Discuss legal and risk management issues in the Emergency Department (ED) and recommendations including how to reduce the most common medication errors that occur in the ED.
- Explain the importance of documenting the use of interpreters for patients with limited English proficiency.
