Participants will learn actionable steps to take to be more LGBTQ-inclusive and changes that can create a more-inclusive organization.

Max Mowitz is a program director with One Iowa and a sexual assault victim advocate with Polk County Crisis and Advocacy. In these roles, Mowitz works in the areas of trauma informed care, sexual violence and assault, mental health, intersecting oppressions related to race, gender identity and sexual orientation, and LGBTQIA-inclusive birth work. Mowitz also works with the transgender and nonbinary communities. Mowitz is a graduate of the One Iowa LGBTQ Leadership Institute and a volunteer at Transformative Healing. Mowitz is pursuing doula certification with a focus on LGBTQIA-specific births and a master's degree in social work at the University of Iowa.
