Course Curriculum

This program will cover the CMS (Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services) hospital Conditions of Participation regulations for Utilization Review. Each hospital that accepts Medicare and Medicaid reimbursement must be compliance with the UR standards to avoid penalties from the Recovery Audit Contractors (RACs) and other organizations such as the OIG.

Does your hospital have a contract with your state Quality Improvement Organization? Is there concise documenting in the chart regarding medical necessity and compliance with the two-midnight rule? This program will also discuss the MOON form required for outpatient observation patients revised in 2020 along with revisions to the detailed notice and IM notice.

This webinar will discuss what is typically found in a UR plan and why hospitals get cited by CMS, including examples from deficiency reports. It will cover the new website to get the CMS manuals and the new email address for sending questions directly to CMS.
