Jeffrey P. Gold, M.D., is a nationally recognized leader and tireless advocate for transforming academic medicine and health care delivery. He became the eighth chancellor of the University of Nebraska Medical Center on Feb. 1, 2014. He also chairs the board of UNMC's principal clinical care system partner, Nebraska Medicine. As UNMC's chief executive officer, Dr. Gold is responsible for all aspects of campus administration, including its annual operating budget of more than \$740 million, a staff of about 5,000 and its 3,800 students. Additionally, Nebraska Medicine has over 6,500 employees and an operating budget of well more than \$1 billion. Dr. Gold holds a health professions academic appointment in the College of Medicine and in the College of Public Health. He serves as a University of Nebraska System Vice President.
