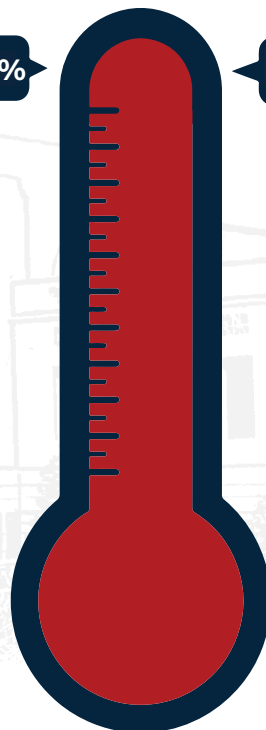

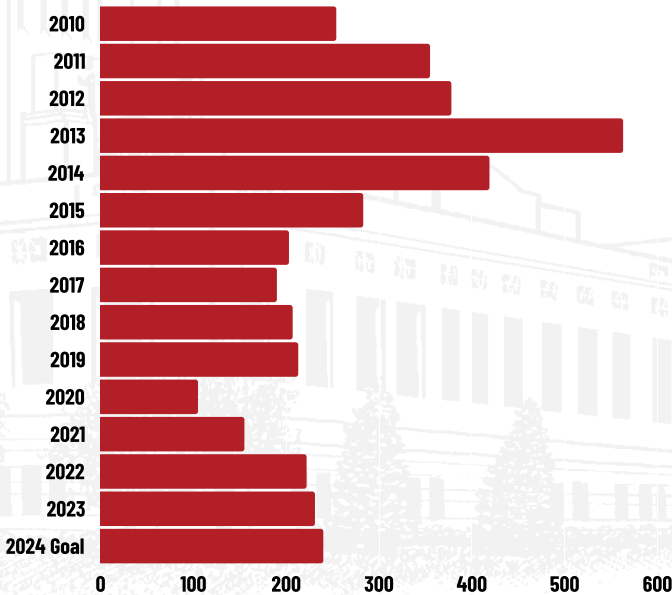

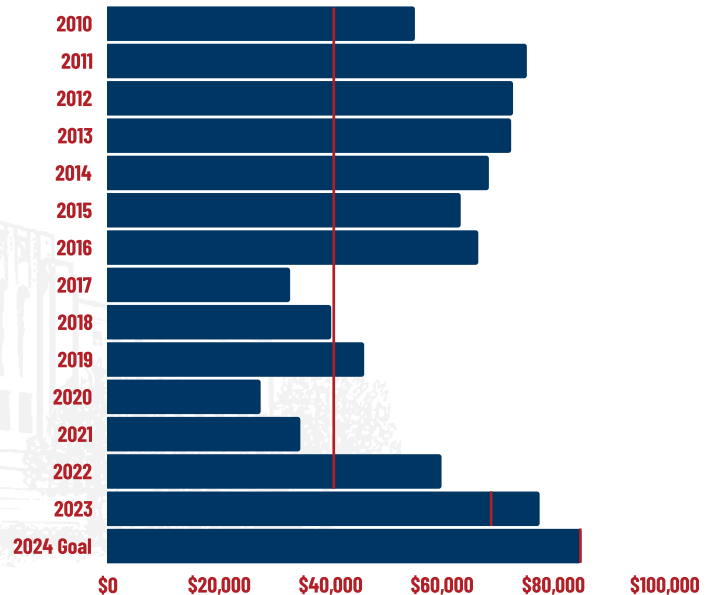

Making a Difference

Every year, decisions are made in Lincoln and Washington that determine the future of Nebraska hospitals. Elected officials who have a passion and understanding for the unique role hospitals play in ensuring the quality of life in their communities, champion our issues. However, not everyone shares our views. It is because of this that it is essential for hospitals and health systems to have a strong and united voice in the political, legislative and regulatory arenas. Your participation makes a difference by strengthening our collective voice.

NHA PAC Purpose

The Nebraska Hospital Association Political Action Committee (NHA PAC) supports the efforts of the Nebraska Hospital Association to advocate on the behalf of Nebraska hospitals by participating in the political process. The NHA PAC supports candidates regardless of political affiliation, whose philosophies, actions and voting records reflect an understanding and concern for hospital and health care issues.

The NHA PAC is a state-only political action committee. Through an agreement with the American Hospital Association (AHA), the NHA PAC also participates in the federal process. The AHAPAC is the political action committee established to support federal candidates. Twenty-five percent of the regular contributions received and 50 percent of Capitol Club, Chairman's Circle and Ben Franklin Club contributions are shared with AHAPAC, unless the contributor designates otherwise. Many of those funds are returned as contributions to NHA-supported candidates for federal office.

NHA PAC BENEFITS

Without financial assistance from supporters, few candidates can afford the cost of a campaign; it's essential that hospitals and health systems are part of the political process.

- NHA PAC allows Nebraska hospitals and health systems to positively impact the election of political candidates who recognize and support health care's important role in the state.
- NHA PAC provides the Association and its members with an enhanced presence at the state level and on Capitol Hill in Washington, D.C.
- NHA PAC improves the ability of the NHA and its members to develop and maintain working relationships with legislators.
- A strong NHA PAC assures you and other members of the hospital family a voice before public policy makers.

Every year at the state and federal level, individuals will debate the future course of health care delivery and expenditures. Supporting NHA PAC is one way you can be sure that Nebraska hospitals have a meaningful voice in the outcomes of these critical decisions.

ABOUT NHA PAC

The NHA Political Action Committee (NHA PAC) is a fund supported through contributions of hospital administrators and staff that are then distributed to those individuals running for office identified as recognizing the importance of health care in Nebraska. Every year, decisions are made in Lincoln and Washington, D.C. that determine the future of Nebraska hospitals. There are champions of our issues—elected officials who have a passion and understanding for the unique role hospitals play in ensuring the quality of life in their communities.

Term limits also diminish the number of champions in office and require urgency in identifying new champions with each election, potential officeholders who are engaged in positive health care discussion and willing to learn about the issues hospitals face in their communities every day. As with any dichotomy, not everyone embraces the importance of effective health care policy. It is essential for hospitals and health systems to have a strong and united voice in the political, legislative and regulatory arenas.

NHA PAC MISSION

The mission of the NHA PAC is to ensure that, with each election, we can strengthen the presence of champions for health care amongst our state and national lawmakers. The NHA PAC and AHAPAC offer an opportunity for individuals to be involved in our state and federal political process. The NHA PAC supports the efforts of the NHA and its members to advocate on behalf of Nebraska hospitals by participating in the political process.

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE IN THE NHA PAC?

Growth of the NHA PAC begins with health care leaders—hospital administrators and the hundreds, if not thousands, of leadership staff in the hospitals across the state that make up the NHA. Hospital employees, officers, directors and stockholders, as well as members of the NHA, may contribute to the NHA PAC.

LEVELS OF GIVING

Any contribution to the NHA PAC will make a significant difference in our efforts to help shape a supportive elected body. Although no donation is too small, the following categories of giving do provide special recognition.

■ 1898 Society

Established in 2018, the "1898 Society" recognizes the founding of the American Hospital Association in Cleveland, OH. A contribution of \$5,000 entitles the donor an invitation to attend a "Leader to Leader" meeting, priority seating at AHAPAC events, invitations to participate in quarterly calls with political experts, access to insider political information related to elections, and recognition at AHA national meetings.

■ Champions Club

A contribution of \$2,500 - \$4,999 entitles the donor to receive priority seating at AHAPAC events, invitations to participate in quarterly calls with political experts, access to insider political information related to elections, and recognition at AHA national meetings.

■ Ben Franklin Club

A contribution of \$1,000 - \$2,499 entitles the donor to membership in both the NHA and AHA Ben Franklin Clubs. Individuals are invited to a special reception and event during AHA's Annual Meeting in Washington, D.C.

■ Chairman's Circle

A contribution of \$500 to \$999 entitles the donor to membership in both the NHA and AHA Chairman's Circles. Individuals are invited to a special event during AHA's Annual Meeting in Washington, D.C.

■ Capitol Club

A contribution of \$350 to \$499 entitles the donor to membership in both the NHA and AHA Capitol Clubs. Individuals are invited to a special event during AHA's Annual Meeting in Washington, D.C.
